The Stanford Alzheimer's Disease Research Center (ADRC) is part of a nationwide network of congressionally mandated Centers of Excellence supported by the National Institutes of Health.

Over 30 ADRCs at major universities work together to translate research advances into improved diagnosis and care for people with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders. The ultimate goals are to cure Alzheimer's disease and, even more important, to prevent it from developing.

The Stanford ADRC works in partnership with the Pacific Udall Center.

In 2020, the Stanford ADRC received 5-year renewal funding from the NIH National Institute of Aging.

In 2021, the Stanford ADRC received a \$10M pledge from the Good Planet Foundation. Endowment income will be used to support the ADRC, and in about 5 years endowment income will add approximately 12% to our annual operating budget, whose principal funding comes from the National Institute on Aging.

To acknowledge this generous pledge, the Stanford ADRC has been named for **Asad Jamal** and **Iqbal Farrukh**. Mr. Jamal is the founder and chairman of ePlanet Capital, a venture capital firm, and Ms. Farrukh is his mother.
